PartNet is the network for participatory health research in German-speaking countries.

PartNet is made of people who are interested in, or have experience and expertise with participation in research.

We are researchers, practitioners, committed people from civil society, and experts with lived experience. Our focus is on participatory processes in the health, social, and educational sectors.

PartNet is a partner network of **ICPHR** (International Collaboration für Participatory Health Research).

PartNet aims to further develop participatory research approaches. For years, members of the network have been developing initiatives, projects, measures, and programs to advance the network's central concerns.

For formal reasons, PartNet cannot be a grantee itself. Therefore, these projects have to be handled by the institutions of the respective members. Nevertheless, in order to make clear that such initiatives are located within PartNet and are involved in the active reflexive exchange of the network, they can be marked as PartNetschaft after a successful application.

We would like to offer participatory researchers the opportunity for visible open access publication - also outside of academic institutions. With the publication series, contributions on participatory research strategies and the further development of methodological approaches in particular are to be given a freely accessible platform. This is intended to promote knowledge transfer and exchange in the research community and to support the implementation of participatory project ideas.

Since 2021, the contributions to the series have been published by PartNet Speakers and dissminated via the PartNet member network and the website. For the authorship of the contributions, a multiperspectivity is explicitly desired, e.g. through contributions from science-practice or campus-community partnerships.
